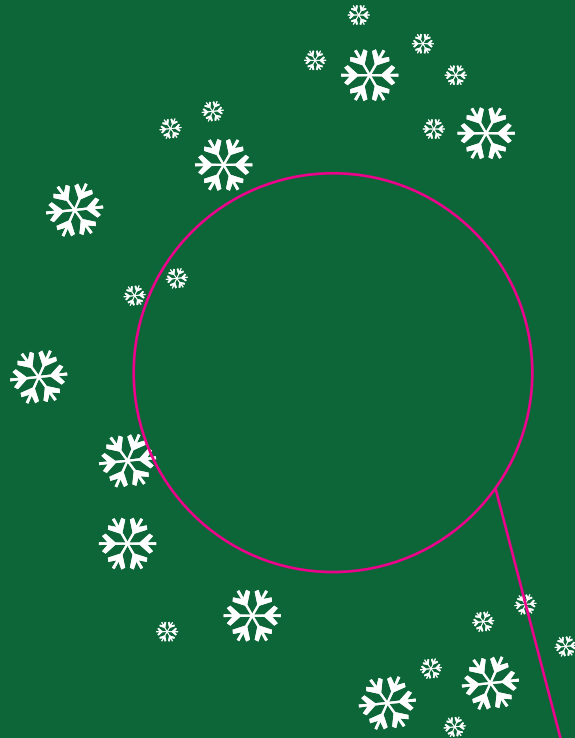

Food waste (turkey bones, sprout peelings)

Paper (White backed wrapping paper. No glitter.)

Glass bottles and jars (mincemeat jars)

Cans and aerosols (squirry cream aerosols and biscuit tins)

Plastic bottles and food containers

Foil (mince pie cases)

Textiles and shoes (Christmas jumpers)

Small electricals (broken fairy lights)

Batteries, mobile phones, printer cartridges, spectacles, engine oil and car batteries

Cardboard and brown paper (Packaging from gift deliveries, greetings cards and gift tags. No glitter.)
